The spirit of the village fete comes to Belper Rugby Club ground for the weekend of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> June with Belper's first ECO festival - the **Belper Goes Green Weekend**. The festival, organised by **Transition Belper**, will be a celebration of the talent and resourcefulness of local people and will have something for everyone. There's no requirement to be an eco-warrior to come along and enjoy local beers, Derbyshire food and home-grown entertainment. You don't need to be an avid recycler to admire some of the incredible arts and crafts – created by recycling unwanted materials - that will be on display, and you don't need to have a great talent to get stuck in, take part and have some fun.

Bring some unwanted clothes or plants and swap them for others that take your fancy or have a go at being a catwalk model in our fun fashion show – fashion for ordinary folk so Kate Moss and Brad Pitt can sit this one out. Join one of our workshops and make a puppet or a mosaic heart or help make a giant willow figure and then leave a sealed bid if you'd like to give it a home in your garden. Or bring your bike and have a go on the bike skills test circuit and then learn how to mend a puncture. Follow all that with some relaxing natural treatments in the health and well-being zone.

If you want to save energy there will be displays of efficient boilers, solar hot water panels and other Glow-worm products, energy efficient LED lighting and the 'Fantastic Home' display with all sorts of energy saving tips and ideas. We'll also have Derbyshire County Council's recycling display and ideas for water saving from Severn Trent.

For those in the DE56 area interested in making a brilliant low carbon future into the 2030s and beyond we'll have various ways you can have your say and get involved in planning Belper's future.

Other local charities and campaigning organisations will also be there to raise funds and express their point of view – that Transition Belper don't necessarily agree with. You make your own mind up.

Attractions, activities and stalls booked so far include...

**Beer Festival** - In the clubhouse there will be 20 or so real ales, many of them from local brewers. The Beer Festival kicks off at 6.00pm on Friday 31st May until 11.00pm. Saturday and Sunday opening is 12.00 midday until 11.00.

  the Temperance Society Blues band.
- **Sunday** 2.00pm will be the Clothes Swap fashion show if we have sufficient volunteers to be models followed by the Belper youth talent showcase. Another opportunity for young talented Belper musicians to shine.

**Cecilia** will not only entertain us with tunes on the hurdy gurdy throughout both days but you can have a quick 15 minute lesson and the chance to have a go yourself.

- As seen in King Street and the Derby Telegraph **Carole Beavis** brings her willow sculpture work. Come and have a go at making a giant willow figure or perhaps something more modest. We'll decide what to do with your creations later.
